Selecting the right BI partner

Leading companies understand that BI standardization is the smart choice. Standardizing on a single business intelligence solution provides benefits that include:

Product considerations

In its white paper, *Standardizing Business Intelligence*, Ventana Research recommends a number of characteristics to look for in a BI standardization solution:

- **Broad coverage.** A standard must meet the needs of as much of the organization as possible. Look for a solution that covers: production reporting, business reporting, ad hoc query, OLAP reporting and analysis, dashboarding, and scorecarding.
- **Modern services-oriented architectures.** Look for technologies that use Web services standards such as SOAP, XML, and WSDL, and that support standards such as JSR and WSRP.
- **Scalability.** Look for vendors who have distributed architectures where load balancing can be distributed across multiple servers. It is best if they can support Unix, Windows, and Linux.
- **Heterogeneous data access.** Your BI standard should be able to model and query against the multiple, heterogeneous data sources within your organization.
- **Global capability.** Since most large companies have employees, customers, and suppliers all over the world, a BI solution must be multilingual. Not all multilingual solutions are created equal. Look for Unicode throughout, not just support for Unicode data sources.
- **Security.** A BI standard should leverage and support your existing enterprise security systems.

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Assessing your BI supplier

Does your BI supplier qualify as a standardization partner? Is your supplier willing to become a true strategic partner? To help you in your evaluation, here are key questions to ask:

- Can your BI solution evolve into a foundation for performance management?
- Do you provide a native Web services-based architecture?
- Is your solution scalable?
- Does it provide global, multilingual capabilities?
- Does the solution have centralized metadata that leverages all of my heterogeneous data?
- Does it leverage my existing security infrastructure?
- Does your solution require any downloads, applets, plug-ins, or third-party support?
- Do you provide all enterprise BI needs with one product?

With ETL capability, data from multiple systems is integrated, cleansed, transformed, and aggregated to deliver a consolidated historical view that drives analysis.
